

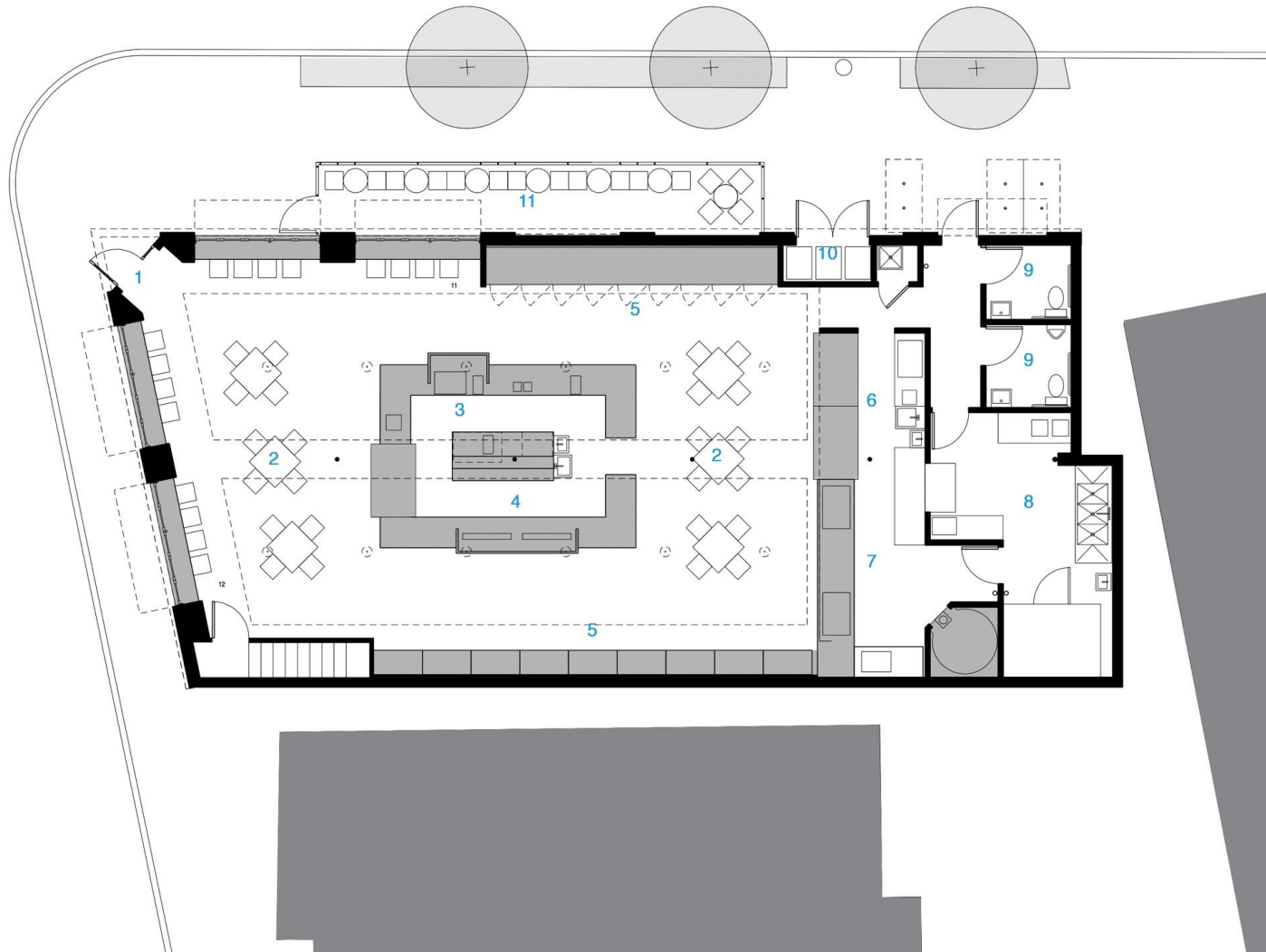
The Market is a modern interpretation of a European bistro market as a neighborhood-friendly delicatessen in the emerging area of the historic Italian Village neighborhood. The Market turned the once dingy convenience store into a place where customers will be able to purchase produce from local farms, beers by bottles or growlers, a variety of wines, as well as a special selection of sauces, breads and pastries, pastas, and spices. Its Italian wood-fired pizzas and specialty coffees are magnets to regulars from the neighborhood and visitors from other areas and afar.





The design aspires to create a gathering place for the community. Atop the Market's entrance is a red, four-foot tall, chicken sculpture, a symbol of nurture for the rising neighborhood. The open-air patio enlivens the street corner, which was once perceived as vacant and dangerous. Connecting the interior space to the outside are the bifold windows on both sides of the building facing the streets. They also create natural ventilation and let aroma and sounds travel freely in and out of the space. The small planters hung at the windows grow herbs that are used for dishes made in the kitchen.

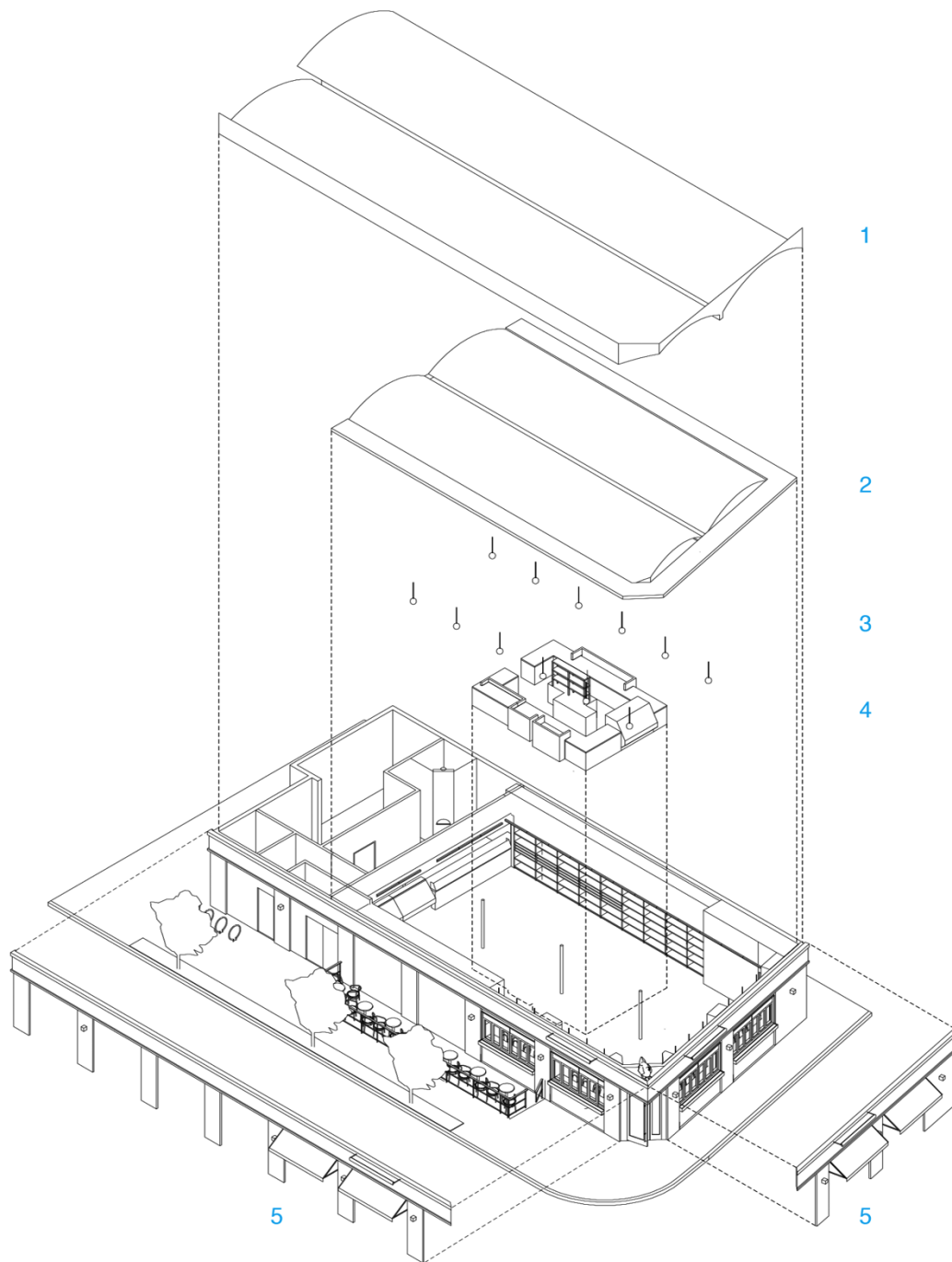


First Floor Plan



Inside the market, the double barrel-vault ceilings was built under the original barrel-vault roof structure; they are newly cladded with wood planks, lit by cove lights. The warmth of the natural material is in contrast with the concrete floors and countertop. The kitchen area, with marble wall tile, is crisp and clean, highlighting the cured meat glass case and the doom-shaped oven, which are special features at the Market.

5. Wooden Storefront with Bi-fold Windows

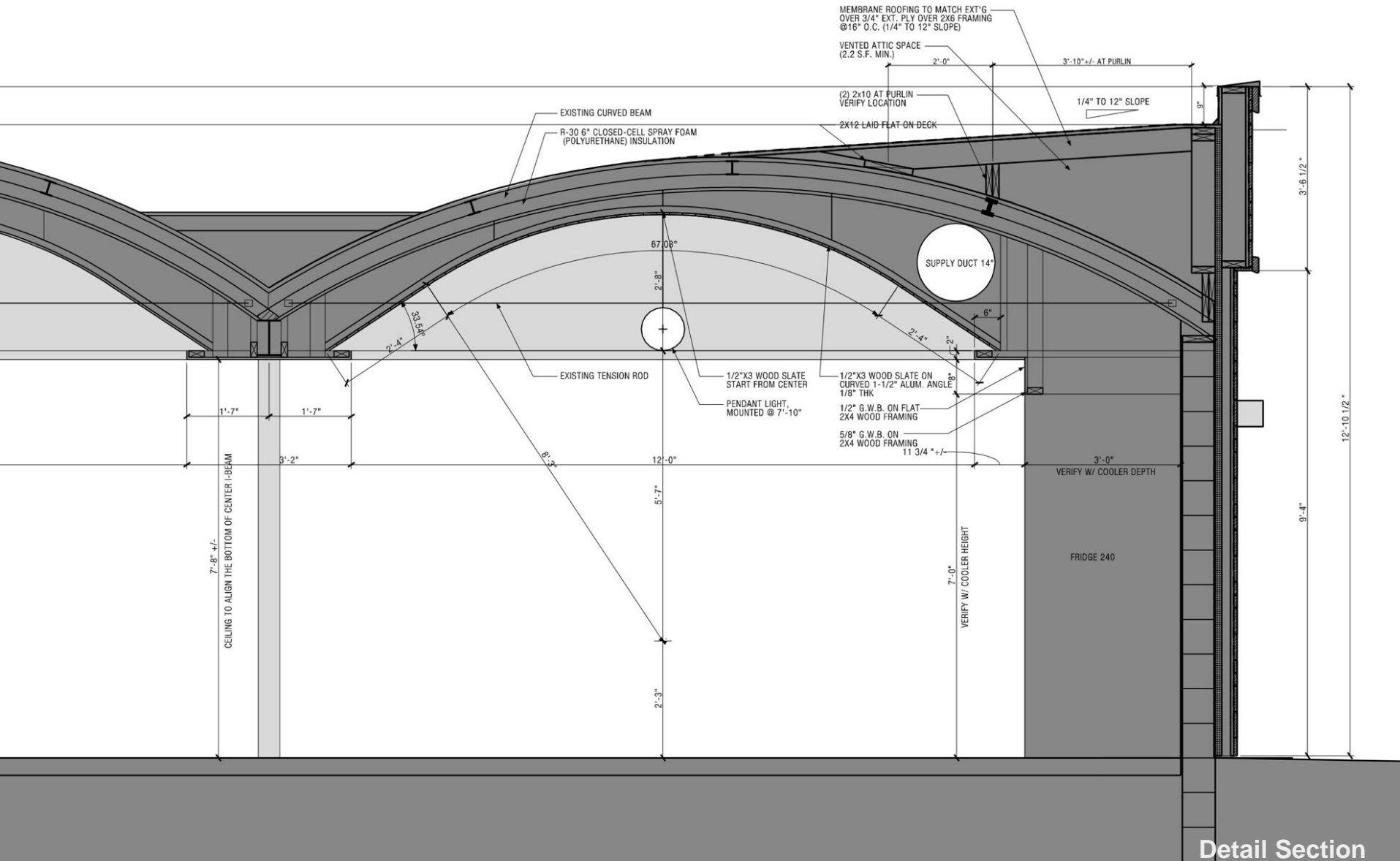
